



STABLES

Our historic Stable Block built in 1770 by Timothy Lightoler is commended for its incredible architecture - but has lots of hidden surprises to uncover too! Enjoy interactive displays and exhibitions to catch a glimpse of stable life in times gone by.

Explore the Huntsman's Office; climb the clock tower to see its mechanisms, visit where the grooms and stable boys would have slept and learn what Victorian stable life was really like.


By the 19th century, the Stables contained four carriage houses. One of these has been renovated as a community art space, and with exhibitions changing throughout the year it's always worth a visit. Discover the only real-life whale in Moby Dick with our 60ft sperm whale skeleton in the old stable barn. Explore even further through the stalls where the horses would have lived and admire former splendour in recently restored areas.


Finally, you can indulge in a little retail therapy in our gift shop with specially selected gifts to remind you of your visit.















HALL

Burton Constable Hall is a spectacular example of an English Country House. Despite its apparent uniformity of style, it has had a complex building history. The Elizabethan mansion you see today is based around an earlier manor house and 12th Century fortified tower, with various 'facelifts' being used over the years to create a uniformity of appearance and hide centuries of additions and alterations, betrayed only by tiny clues in the brick and stonework.

Inside the House there are up to 30 rooms for you to explore. The jaw-dropping diversity from one room to the next is what makes our house so unique. Contrasting styles and collections, from Chippendale chairs and Tudor portraits to inkwells and dragons reveal the unique tastes and curiosities of the owners of this much-loved family home. Enjoy the child friendly trails and popular attractions such as the Cabinet of Curiosities!

For over 700 years the Constable family have indulged their flights of fancy, shaping the house and its grounds into the spaces you see today. Why not book yourself on to one of our monthly tours, led by one of our expert guides? You may then get the chance to climb to the servant quarters in the derelict attic rooms on the 14 Landing, delve into the Cellars or marvel at breath-taking landscape views across the Hall's chimneys and rooftops from the top of Stephen's Tower (the oldest part of the building).

EXHIBITIONS & EVENTS

Throughout the year we have a whole host of events and entertainments for all audiences. Join us for the popular holiday periods of Easter, Halloween and Christmas, and take advantage of the added atmosphere and activities on offer. We're always looking for ways to entertain the kids through the school holidays too, with workshops, crafts and more!

In the house there are talks, tours and trails, while our annual exhibitions give further insight to the history and heritage of Burton Constable. Our community art gallery in the Carriage House hosts monthly art exhibitions, often available to purchase.

The Grounds accommodate events such as the Classic Car Show, Flower Show, Last Night of the Proms and 'Live on the Lawn' (our series of spectacular summer shows).


PARKLAND


Since 1999 a comprehensive programme of parkland restoration has been undertaken and is still ongoing, funded through Natural England's countryside stewardship scheme. Improvements to the haha and planting to recreate tree clumps are just two examples you will see of this crucial work to restore our 330 acres of Grade II* parkland to its former glory.

Please, assist us by adhering to the countryside code at all times.

LAWNS

Take advantage of our sprawling lawns surrounding the Hall and unwind, relax and picnic in the most peaceful of settings. Escape into our North Garden to enjoy views across the pond and out across the medieval village of Burton Constable. WALKS & TRAILS


Stretch your legs and make the most of being in the great outdoors. As advocates of exercise and well-being, our walks and trails are designed to stimulate your senses. You will have access to our entire site, enjoying glorious views and scenic wildlife whilst nature takes its toll on your soul, with fun trails for all the family to

get involved in too!

WILDLIFE & NATURE

Keep your eyes peeled throughout the seasons to watch the landscape change and different wildlife and flowers appear. Be it the buzzards swooping through the trees, swans sailing on the lakes or brown hares running free, there's plenty to see!

The pasture continues to be managed without the use of fertilisers to encourage a diversity of plant species and insects. The sheep which you can see grazing in the parkland add further beauty to Brown's landscape.





THE ORANGERY

Built in the 1780s and decorated with Coadestone statuary, our recently restored and renovated Orangery is open for you to access and enjoy a sensory indoor experience. Aromas of oranges and lemons fill the air and continue to flourish here, much as they did when providing food for the Constable family table. Today, however, they're more likely to inspire recipes in the Stables Kitchen for our guests!

CAPABILITY BROWN

In the 1770s, William Constable commissioned Lancelot 'Capability' Brown to landscape the park. In doing so, Brown created clumps and avenues of trees to break up the flat landscape, adhering to his own philosophy of making "Small Clumps are nothing, only pimples upon the Face of Nature – make your Clumps large & massy". Furthermore, he joined up existing Tudor fishponds to create serpentine lakes separated by a dam-cum-bridge which provided a new picturesque approach to the Hall from the south-west.

OUTDOOR PLAY AREA

Are you in the mood for a game of giant chess? Make the most of our outdoor facilities and play equipment, along with the child-friendly play area. Just make sure children must be supervised at all times.
